Session I

A. Regulations...Game Show Style! (Nicole Dillon)—How well do you know the OCFS regulations? If you have been a provider for years or just starting out, there is always something to learn. We will present the regulations in game show style, and also talk about best practices that go above and beyond the basic requirements. OCFS:7,8, CBK: 6

B. PBS Resources (Jackie Stapleton-Durham)—Get up to speed on the latest educational media from PBS KIDS and PBS EDUCATION. We'll review the current PBS KIDS programming, try our hand at the newest apps & activities, and create our own free PBS Learning Media account. This workshop will cover a variety of topics including STEM, Literacy, and Social/Emotional Development OCFS: 3, CBK:1,4



Session II

A. Educating Minds & Hearts (Kathy Ryan)—In this training we will stress the importance of children having well developed social/emotional skills to succeed in kindergarten and life; the characteristics of environments that support children's social-emotional development and learning; and how you can embed opportunities for social-emotional learning and development in your program. Participants will leave with "I Feel Better" cards for their program OCFS: 1, 3 CBK: 1

B. Learning Through Play (Lenny Grozier)—Participants will explore the power of play-based instruction through the creation and implementation of do-it-yourself games. The developmental benefits for young children will be identified. Several low-cost game ideas will be made available along with instructions. Flow-up activity suggestions will be provided along with tips on how to involve families in their child's learning journey. OCFS: 1,3 CBK:2,4

Introduction to the Pyramid Model: Promoting Social and Emotional Competence and Addressing Challenging Behaviors

(Tracy Lyman) This session will provide an overview of the Pyramid Model. Topics to be covered will include ways to support young children's social and emotional development to prevent challenging behaviors. A focus on building positive relationships with children and families, along with creating an environment that supports the teaching of social emotional skills, will be targeted. OCFS: 1, 3 CBK: 1, 4
