Keynote Speaker:

Betsy Kenney—Director of the Office of Early Learning at NYSED. Betsy's responsibilities include oversight of pre-K funding, with over \$830 million earmarked for programs across the state, as well as providing ongoing support and guidance to staff and the field to meet Department and program goals and mandates. Betsy has spent over 20 years working in the field of early childhood education. Throughout her professional career she has had a great deal of experience supervising personnel and managing large state and federal grant programs. She currently serves on several statewide early childhood committees where she focuses on the importance of fostering Pre-K to 3rd grade learning continuum that is culturally, linguistically, and developmentally appropriate for children.

Morning Session A:

Katherine McKeever & Tina Reilly—

ISO (In Search Of)

Katherine will share knowledge on how to help children with special needs in a way that addresses their individual differences. Knowledge has a beginning, but no END.

Morning Session B:

Cathy—Screen Time in a Digital Age!

This program will discuss areas of consideration when making recommendations to families concerning screen time as well as offer suggestions so that adults can become Media Mentors.

Keynote Address:

Foundations for School Success

Betsy will discuss efforts underway to better align the State's early care, preschool and early childhood education systems and create a comprehensive plan to ensure that all children in New York State thrive from birth, flourish in preschool, enter the school age program on a trajectory of success.

Afternoon Session A:

Betsy Kenney—Standards for Learning; Not Standardization of Instruction!

Betsy will provide a high level introduction to the Next Generation Early Learning Standards, and will discuss the importance of play for young children as well as how classroom environments support young children's social emotional learning.

Afternoon Session B:

Lenny Grozier—Creating a Winning Hand with the Cards You're Dealt: Recognizing Factors that Affect Behavior

This session will explore several strategies for building and supporting healthy relationships with children in order to help them reach their optimal potential. Attendees will learn about easy-to-implement techniques that are sensitive to diverse temperaments and preferences. Multiple examples will be highlighted to create individualized experiences for children.
