** Registration Information **

IMPORTANT PAYMENT INFORMATION

SUNY Professional Development Program Educational Incentive Program (EIP): EIP is a voluntary scholarship program and may be available to help cover the costs of trainings. Please apply for EIP at www.ecetp.pdp.albany.edu. We do not want EIP applications or a copy of your income taxes. We only need proof of EIP eligibility (for example, approval letter, denial letter). If you are 100% eligible for EIP funding, you do not have to pay a copay. If you are 75% eligible for EIP, you will need to pay the remaining balance due. EIP vouchers must be signed and turned in for each training.

CSEA/VOICE Professional Development Training Program: Family Enrichment Network is an approved training organization. Family and group family child care providers can obtain their CSEA ID and apply for training scholarships through http://voicecsea.org/.

FEN Scholarship: A FEN Scholarship may be available to help you cover the training cost, if eligible. Eligibility for the FEN Scholarship will be reviewed annually. Proof of income will be reviewed, as well as program financial information. Economic hardships will be evaluated on an individual basis; this will determine your co-pay amount. Upon award, you will receive a voucher for each class you are approved for. You must turn in the voucher as payment for each training.

You will not be enrolled in training until payment is made or proof of scholarship is provided.

Classes not eligible for scholarships are listed. To be eligible for EIP, classes must be approved through SUNY PDP and conducted by a credentialed or verified trainer. Classes are submitted for approval by our trainers.

Classes not currently approved for EIP include MAT and the Health and Safety Training (for non-registered/licensed providers).

All classes should be eligible for the CSEA/VOICE scholarship, as Family Enrichment Network is an approved training organization.

Classes not eligible for the FEN Scholarship include MAT, Health and Safety Training (start-up grants may be available for providers in the process of registration or licensing), Fall Conference, CPR/First Aid, and CDA. The FEN Scholarship is designed for single, evening classes.
