You might ask yourself, why would I take a GED test? Did you graduate from high school? If not, then the GED test is a means to complete your schooling and achieve your High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma. The GED test is recognized and accepted by employers. GED stands for General Educational Development, and the test has four components: mathematical reasoning, science, social studies and reasoning through language arts, which includes a section for writing. These are the four core subjects that make up most high school curriculums and are required for students to earn their high school diploma. Passing the GED is as if you received your high school diploma. Obtaining your GED will enable you to apply for competitive employment or pursue college.

It doesn't matter why someone wasn't able to finish high school. Statistics are showing that many of our young people fell through the COVID cracks of learning especially in the areas of Math and Reading and they need help. We are offering a non-judgmental atmosphere where learning can take place in these four core areas.
