OPWDD Services at FEN

Family Enrichment Network currently provides two OPWDD services. First, you may ask what is OPWDD? OPWDD is an acronym for—Office for People with Developmental Disabilities. Eligibility is based on a doctor diagnosed disability before the age of 22. Developmental disabilities are a group of conditions due to an impairment in physical, learning, language, or behavior areas. These conditions begin during the developmental period, may impact day-to-day functioning, and last throughout a person's lifetime. There are many different kinds of disabilities and have been categorized into: auditory, visual, mobility, and cognitive. The most common disability has been determined to be intellectual disabilities.

If you or a loved one has a diagnosed disability such as autism, Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, and others that affect independent living, and you would like to receive services, you will need to go through what is known as The Front Door. When you go through the Front Door you have access to resources that will most benefit the individual. The Front Door Office in the Southern Tier can be contacted by dialing 607-240-4900. The key component of getting services is choosing a care manager that will advocate on your behalf to seek out the best plan of action—the Front Door is key in helping you connect with a Care Management Agency.

As an approved OPWDD Provider Agency, Family Enrichment Network provides <u>Community Habilitation (Com Hab)</u> and <u>Community Based Prevocational (Community Prevoc)</u> services.

If someone with a disability has a desire to be more involved in their community, engage in hobbies and other areas of interest, learn new or develop healthy, safe and good independent living skills, then Com Hab is for them. They will develop a person centered plan with a member of our staff and care manager which may include: volunteering, walking programs, exercise programs, money management to name a few.

If someone has the desire to seek out a job in the community, then <u>Prevoc</u> is for them. Prevoc will help us discover their capabilities through a variety of skill building experiences in local businesses. This is accomplished through volunteer experiences, classes, skill building activities, shadowing, handson experiences, and more. A person centered plan would be developed with a member of our staff and care manager.
