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From the Desk of the Executive Director

The Agency just completed its annual meeting and training day for staff at Traditions at the Glen. I would like to thank the Traditions staff for making the event very easy and very successful. During my presentation, I reviewed what we have done over the past year and the challenges we face in the coming year.

Everything we do or don't do makes a difference. We are in an okay funding cycle with Early Childhood Development. We have been successful in developing new program slots but not successful in increasing the rate for those slots. We need to be forward-looking and assertive, bordering on aggressive, in terms of future program development. The children and families of this community need it and deserve it.

We are encountering ongoing funding challenges for making our programs competitive. These funding issues make it difficult to maintain and attract new staff to our Agency. Our main competitors are health service agencies and schools. As they increase their salaries and we remain stagnant, it worsens the situation. Add that to the significant decrease in the

Southern Tier population and the situation becomes even more difficult.

The next issue is the recent state mandated increase in minimum wage. As I have stated before, we fully support a minimum wage increase, but only if fully funded. This mandate is not funded in any manner. We are making some progress with legislators, but have a long way to go.

Other fixed costs such as Workers Compensation, New York State Disability, Unemployment Insurance and Health Insurance are increasing with no corresponding increase in funding. These too become unfunded mandates. All of this puts increased pressure on our budgets.

We have built an organization and a staff structure that has placed us in a great position for the future. In the past, we have been able to weather the funding challenges and continue to be in a good position. Because of what we have done in the past, we are positioned better than most not-for-profit organizations. We have been forward thinking and assertive and we must continue to be so. We have started the process to serve a new population; working with adults with disabilities in a number of different areas. This will add a new dimension to our Agency.

The most important job in the world, caring for our young children, should not be the lowest paid. In childcare, cheaper is not better. "Cheaper" results in poor quality, high staff turnover, and a decrease in people pursuing careers in child care. The long-term answer continues to be a cooperative effort between government, not-for-profits, and the business community.

We could not function without the support of the staff, the Governing Board and the entire community. Our staff this past year, has worked tirelessly, to assist us in moving this Agency forward and meeting the needs of children and families. We thank you for your past support of our Agency and look forward to future partnership opportunities.



FEN's Clinic Plus Program

It is natural to measure your child's height and weight, or to assess their hearing, vision or other health concerns. It is equally important to assess children's emotional development. Emotional health issues can affect how children perform in school, how they relate to family members, and their ability to make friends. Family Enrichment Network and Broome County Mental Health are pleased to make a *free*, *voluntary*, *and confidential* questionnaire available to help you assess your child's emotional health.

The Strengths and Difficulties Questionnaire will be distributed to parents of Head Start students via their Family Advocate. Parents/guardians should take a moment to review the packet, complete the questions with the advocate, and return the survey to school in the envelope provided. The Clinic Plus Coordinator will score the assessments and return results *only to the parent/guardian*, unless they have provided consent to share the results with Head Start staff.

Community Habilitation...What is it?

Family Enrichment Network is now offering Community Habilitation services. Community Habilitation is a waiver program funded by Medicaid and is available to children and adults with developmental and intellectual disabilities. Individuals residing in certified settings and also in the community, either with family or on their own, are eligible for this program. The goal of Community Habilitation is to provide community integration and independent living skills. The individual will either have the option to choose and hire their own staff or they can choose to work with an agency hired staff. The number of hours of Community Habilitation that a person can receive can range from 3-20 hours per week or more-depending on the needs of the person. The Community Habilitation staff provides all transportation to individuals in the program. Community Habilitation is a self-directed service, meaning that the individual decides what goals are important to work on and how the goals will be met. This is a fun and educational program that supports independent living and is a great opportunity for people to get involved in their community and learn new skills.
