Nutrition Outreach and Education Program

For the last 15 years the Nutrition Outreach and Education Program (NOEP) has been one of the programs in the Family Support Services Department at Family Enrichment Network. This program was designed to remove the barriers and challenges preventing eligible people from applying for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits.

SNAP is the current name for food stamps and there are many reasons that food insecure people are not receiving SNAP benefits. These include: rural residents with no transportation, home-bound seniors, those with literacy deficits or difficulty completing forms, those who do not have copies of needed documents or have trouble understanding confusing regulations.

The NOEP Coordinator's (NC) job is to help remove these barriers to allow as many food insecure people as possible, to access SNAP. Hunger or food insecurity creates serious damage in a community, when children are unable to learn properly at school, seniors or those with medical conditions/disabilities cannot keep healthy because of lack of nutrition and poor working families don't get enough to eat. SNAP is available to everyone who is eligible and is not a handout, anymore than social security is a handout for retired individuals.

The NC helps with the SNAP application process, first conducting a prescreen for potential eligibility, then meeting in a convenient location such as home, community or office, next making copies of required documents and finally setting up the SNAP phone interview at the Department of Social Services (DSS). The completed SNAP applications are hand delivered to DSS and the NC remains an advocate for the SNAP applicant in case any issues should arise with the application.
